

Tasks for K9A Event

The K9A special event station and activity has several items to be completed to operate,

2. The QRZ.com site has to have information updated about the event.
3. The ARRL has a Special Event submittal so it shows up in the QST magazine.

About Secondary Callsigns
 A **secondary** callsign is your callsign with a stroke (/) plus a special identifier. An example would be **KB9QG/QRP** where the **/QRP** is a special identifier. These can be for domestic (your country) or DX use. For DX use, they will typically be a prefix or suffix of the DX land, such as **KB9QG/VP2** where the **/VP2** is the foreign suffix.
